About the symposium

This symposium has the goal to provide a platform to exchange information and know-how on status and protection of bats in the region. Presentations on best practices, lesson learnts, methodologies and results of monitoring of bats are especially welcome.

About the project

Despite their ecological importance, bats suffer from a very negative perception. Since 1994, the Agreement on the Conservation of Populations of European Bats (UNEP/EUROBATS) has been signed by 35 EU member and range states. Bosnia and Herzegovina has not yet signed such agreement. The long-term aim of the project "*Let's be friendly to bats together*" is to promote the signing of the EUROBATS agreement by Bosnia and Herzegovina while on the short medium range to provide capacity building on bat conservation for local NGOs, scientific community and public officials. The project is funded through a standard grant from the Visegrad fund and implemented by the Slovak Bat Conservation Society, Mammal Conservation Group of BirdLife Hungary, Center for Karst and Speleology (Bosnia and Herzegovina) and Green Federation GAJA (Poland).
